Program Overview

- 15% of Measure A Program
- Purpose of program is to improve safety at railroad crossing and relieve traffic congestion
- Projects include construction/upgrade of underpasses or overpasses at key road crossings along the Caltrain and Dumbarton rail lines.

Guiding Principles: Funding

- TA Board approved guiding principles for the program at its 4/4/13 meeting
- \$200 million is estimated to be available over the remaining life of Measure A
- Allocate <u>at least</u> 80% of remaining funds for construction
- Allocate <u>up to</u> 20% for pre-construction, with at least 10% for design



Guiding Principles: Programming & Allocation

- Program and allocate funds to separate project phases:
 - Planning/Project Study Report
 - Preliminary Engineering/Environmental Assessment
 - Design
 - Construction

Guiding Principles: Programming & Allocation

- Planning/Project Study Report
 - Include Caltrain in the planning process
 - Consistent with Caltrain/HSR blended system
 - Study project alternatives & develop cost estimates
- Preliminary Engineering/Environmental
 - Complete necessary Federal and/or State environmental assessment
 - Have City Council approval and Caltrain concurrence with selected alternative

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Guiding Principles: Programming & Allocation

- Design
 - Complete design with Caltrain to ensure railroad design standards are met
 - Have City Council approval and Caltrain concurrence with the selected alternative
- Construction
 - Constructed by Caltrain
 - Have full funding plan
 - Have City Council approval and Caltrain concurrence with the selected alternative



Proposed Project Evaluation Criteria



Proposed Call-for-Projects Process

- First Round of Call-for-Projects in Fall 2013
 - Next round in 2 years
- Approximately \$5 million to \$7 million available in 2013
- Proposed Measure A maximums:
 - Planning phase: up to \$1 million
 - Preliminary Engineering/Environmental: up to \$5 million
- Coordination with Caltrain on cost estimates to complete work
- · Evaluation of requests by a staff panel

Proposed Evaluation Criteria

- Project Readiness 20%
- Safety and Traffic Improvement 35%
- Project Need and Justification 35%
- Funding Leverage 10%

Criteria Category		Detailed Criteria
Safety and Traffic Improvement - 35%	Safety Improvement and Local Traffic Congestion Relief	 CPUC 190 Priority Index Number: Average Daily Vehicle Traffic Average Daily Train Traffic Volume Accident History (number of accidents at crossing) Special Conditions Factor, including vehicle speed limit, crossing blocking delay, types of vehicles at crossing, crossing geometrics, etc. Project cost share to be allocated from the PUC190 fund

	Project Effectiveness	Overall effectiveness and cohesiveness as measured by how project addresses: - Need - Safety/local traffic improvement
	Economic Development	Project's link to economic development, TODs, and/or PDAs

Funding - 10%	Budget, Funding Plan and Leverage	Local Match Contribution (sliding scale for more matching funds) Comprehensive Budget Plan
