The legislature amended a bill that would authorize local agencies to continue to meet remotely during a declared state of emergency, and if it passes and the Governor were to sign it by October 10, it would take effect immediately.
 - o If current orders are left to expire, then the JPB must provide a location where public and/or Board members can meet.
 - The Board approved a motion to give Chair Davis the authority to determine how to handle future Board October meetings.
