# CONFERENCE WITH LEGAL COUNSEL REGARDING INITIATION OF LITIGATION:

### SALES TAX MEASURE TO SUPPORT CALTRAIN - DISCUSSION HIGHLIGHTS:

The Board elected to add an emergency agenda item following the Report of the General Manager/CEO to provide the Board with the opportunity to comment on a critical resolution being considered at the JPB Special Meeting the following morning, August 6 regarding a proposed sales tax measure for Caltrain.

Carter Mau, Deputy General Manager/CEO, said that the resolution contains direction for the Caltrain board on several topics, including the expenditure of the revenues that would be generated from the sales tax measure, modifications to Caltrain governance, appointment of new legal counsel, appointment of a new auditor, repayment to SamTrans, and rules for placing items on the Caltrain agenda.

Chair Dave Pine noted that he was part of the team assembling the resolution going before the JPB Board. He said that it is crucial that a sales tax measure go before the voters.

The Board members expressed their support for Chair Pine's leadership on the JPB Board in attempting to preserve Caltrain service. It was noted that Caltrain is an essential service for essential workers.

#### MOTION TO APPROVE SUPPORT OF SB 288:

The Board approved support for California Senate Bill 288 (Wiener), which is calling for further exemptions from lead agencies on projects to complete an Environmental Impact Report under CEQA (California Environmental Quality Act). The bill would further exempt a few types of projects, including new rapid transit bus or light rail services.
