## **Board Highlights**

April Chan, General Manager/CEO, highlighted under her General Manager's report:

- Welcomed County Supervisor Jackie Speier to the SamTrans Board
- Thanked Supervisor Ray Mueller for his service on the Board
- Lunar New Year and Black History Month buses will be operating throughout the County during the month of February
- Thanked Chair Gee for attending Black History Month celebrations in Redwood City
- Discussed US Department of Transportation (DOT) released guidance last week aimed at scrutinizing DOT policies and programs to align them with the Administration's policy goals; there are concerns that grants awarded or to be awarded would be impacted resulting from these policy realignments. Grants possibly impacted include over \$143 million in federal funding for our replacement of fleet with hydrogen fuel cell buses.
- SamTrans sent out a message to our employees to ensure them that we operate a system that welcomes everyone on our buses in response to rumors that ICE (US Immigration and Customs Enforcement) has been apprehending riders. We are also developing protocols for our front-line employees.
- Staff will be scheduling a board workshop with the Board late March or early April to discuss the financial outlook along with the proposed 10-year CIP. Noted for today's meeting there would be an update on progress of the new SamTrans headquarters

project, a refunding of the 2015 bonds issued, and a presentation on transitoriented development policy

## **Community Relations Committee**

<u>Accessible Services Update</u> - Tina Dubost, Manager, Accessible Services, stated continuing community outreach at Veterans Village and looking at ways to encourage more community members to use transit.

<u>Paratransit Advisory Council Update</u> - Ben McMullan, Chair of PAC, stated the PAC would be scheduling a new member orientation by the end of February.

<u>Monthly State of the Service Report | December 2024</u> - Ana Rivas, Director Bus Transportation, provided a report on increasing weekday ridership (10.9 percent) and total ridership recovery (98.7 percent).

#### **Finance Committee**

Approving 2025 Debt Refinancing and Authorizing Issuance of San Mateo County Transit District Limited Tax Bonds: Approving Forms, Authorizing Execution and Delivery Thereof; Amending and Restating Debt Policy and the Continuing Disclosure Policy, and Completing Associated Disclosure Training - Kate Jordan Steiner, Chief Financial Officer, provided a presentation regarding the 2015 bonds, stating first opportunity in 2025 to refund the bonds based on reduced interest rates and S&P (Standard and Poor) AAA rating. The Board also received bond disclosure training from Rudy Salo, Partner, Nixon Peabody LLC.

## Strategic Planning, Development, and Sustainability Committee

<u>Informational Presentation of the Proposed Transit Oriented Development (TOD) and Property Disposition Policy</u> - Janni Baugh, Deputy Director, Real Estate Management and Development, provided a presentation that included past completed projects and anticipated sites under evaluation for future development. She emphasized that the policy will focus on creating transit-supportive communities, supporting SamTrans operations, ensuring local and regional collaboration, and supporting affordability and density.

## **Legislative Committee**

## Legislative Update

Jessica Epstein, Director, Government and Community Affairs, provided an update that included the following:

- Federal updates regarding the uncertainty of funding following recent Executive Orders, including awarded funds not yet executed or undergoing appropriations process, and low or zero-emission bus technology grants
- State updates including the Governor's January 10 release of 2025-2026 budget showing minor surplus with an expected May revise; no funding cuts; review of prospective bills,

including Senate Bill 272, which would make it unnecessary to redo the bidding process for repairs and maintenance for projects \$5 million and under

Regional updates include MTC (Metropolitan Transportation Commission) regional funding measure and upcoming results from the polling.

## **Closed Session**

Joan Cassman, Legal Counsel, reported on the closed sessions from January 8, 2025, where the Board had no reportable action.

There was one closed session including a conference about Public Employee Performance Evaluation. Ms. Cassman stated that any action taken will be reported at the next SamTrans Board Meeting on March 5, 2025.
