5. TA Board Item 11.a. 84-101 Reimagined Project Update

Vamsi Tabjulu, Project Manager, Transportation Authority, Karen Pachmeyer, Project Manager, City of Redwood City, and Tanisha Werner, Director of Transportation and Engineering, City of Redwood City, provided the presentation that included the following:

- 195 collisions from 2018-2022 with rear-end collisions at 49 percent
- Limited bike facilities in five-legged intersection
- Benefits to travel time, air quality, bike/pedestrian improvements, traffic congestion, multi-modal connectivity, accident reduction
- Total funding of \$385 million, with fully secured grant application funding of \$105 million from Infrastructure For Rebuilding America (INFRA) and \$14.165 million from the 2024 Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP)
- \$61.4 million increase in costs from July 2024

• Federal:

- One Big Beautiful Act passed- no direct impacts to transportation programs but withdraws funding from Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) programs
- House Fiscal Year 2026 appropriation bills
- Undecided timeline for Senate's markup of the Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development bill

• State:

- 2025 Budget Act signing and trailer bills- restoration of \$1.1 billion for transit operations
- No extension of Cap-and-Trade Program beyond 2030; \$500 million to backfill state general fund expenditures
- Possible implications from reconciliation to state safety net programs

Senate Bill (SB) 63 Update

As of late August 2025, the San Mateo County Transit District has officially voted to opt in to SB63, a regional transportation funding measure. The bill, if passed by voters in 2026, would authorize a half-cent sales tax in participating Bay Area counties.

SB 63 Status in San Mateo County

- Opted In: On August 6, 2025, the San Mateo County Transit District Board of Directors voted to join the regional Transportation Revenue Measure District C (TRMD) created by SB 63.
- Voter approval required: The measure will appear on the November 2026 ballot within several Bay Area counties, including San Francisco, Alameda, Contra Costa, San Mateo, and Santa Clara Counties, where voters will have the final say on the sales tax.
- Transit funding: The proposed tax would generate an estimated \$186 million annually for San Mateo County, including approximately \$32.5 million for Caltrain and over \$45 million for SamTrans operations.
- Accountability measures: San Mateo County leaders expressed concerns about Bay Area Rapid Transit's (BART) financial management and SB 63 has been amended to include strong accountability measures. The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) will conduct an independent financial efficiency review of major operators receiving funding.
- Financial stability: The funding from the measure is intended to help prevent devastating service cuts to Caltrain and other transit agencies facing major deficits.

(Caltrain projects an average annual deficit of \$75 million starting in fiscal year 2027 and BART is averaging an ongoing structural deficit ranging from \$350 million to \$400 million starting in about a year.)

Status of SB 63 in the State Legislature

The bill is currently working its way through the California Assembly.

- Assembly suspense file: The bill was placed on the Assembly Appropriations Committee suspense file on August 20, 2025, as part of the Legislative process.
- Previous passage: It successfully passed the State Senate on June 2, 2025.
