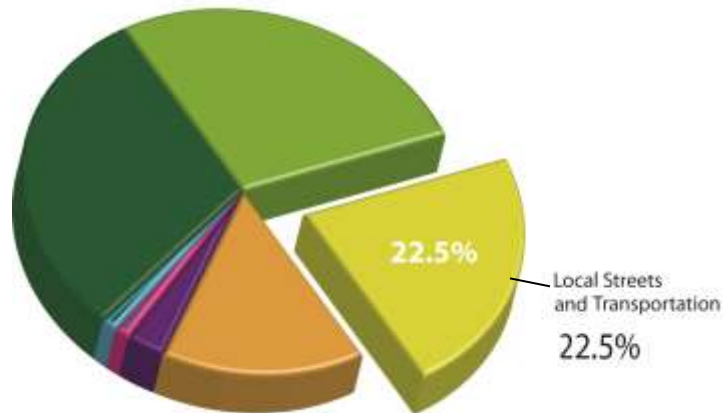

Provides an assured source of funding to cities and County for local streets, and funds improvements and maintenance to:

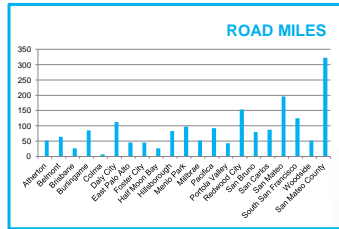
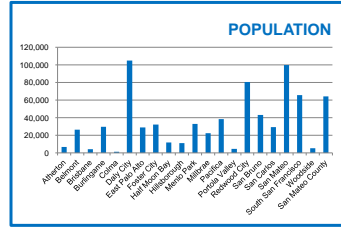
- Maintain local streets and roads, pave streets, and repair potholes and sidewalks
- Promote and operate alternate modes of transportation such as shuttles, sponsor carpools, and bicycling & pedestrian programs
- Develop and implement traffic operations and safety projects, including signal coordination
- Develop bicycle and pedestrian safety projects that eliminate hazardous conditions

## Funding Distribution Formula

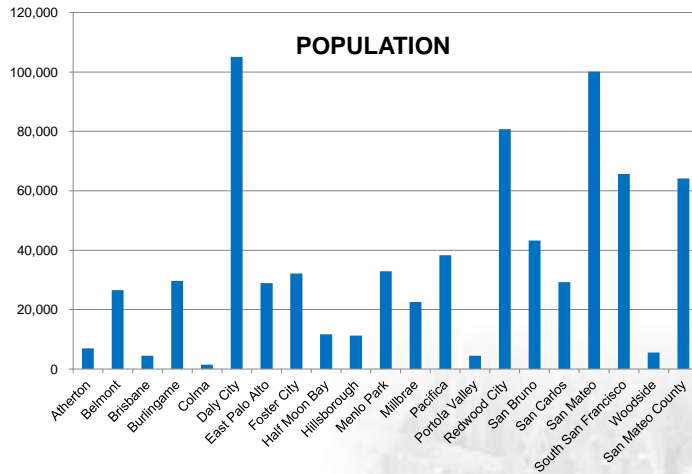
Based 50% on

in each jurisdiction

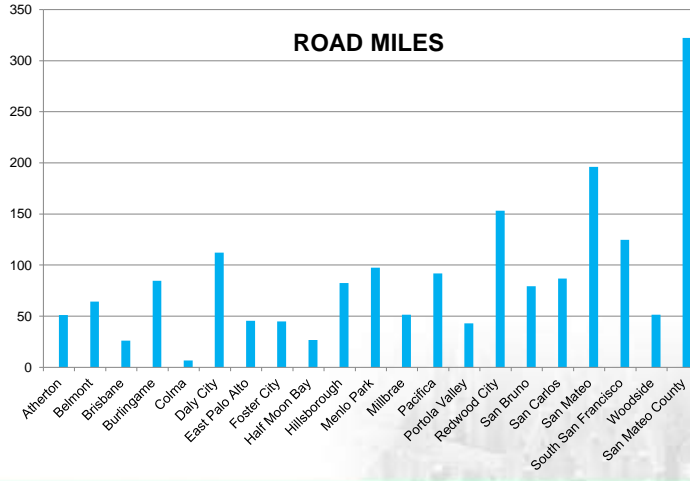

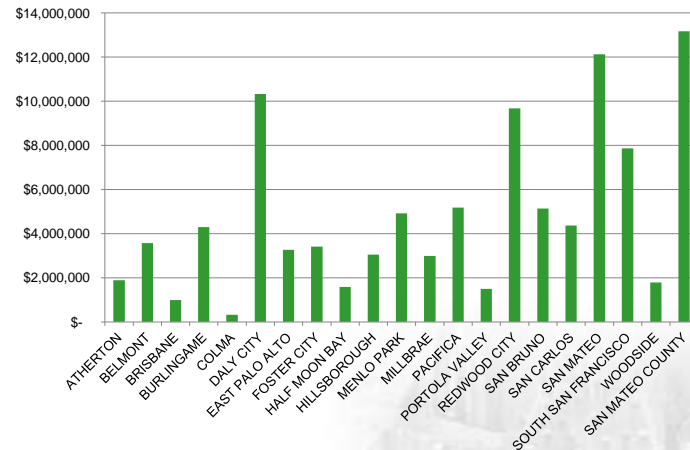

New Measure A Program: \$101,411,095

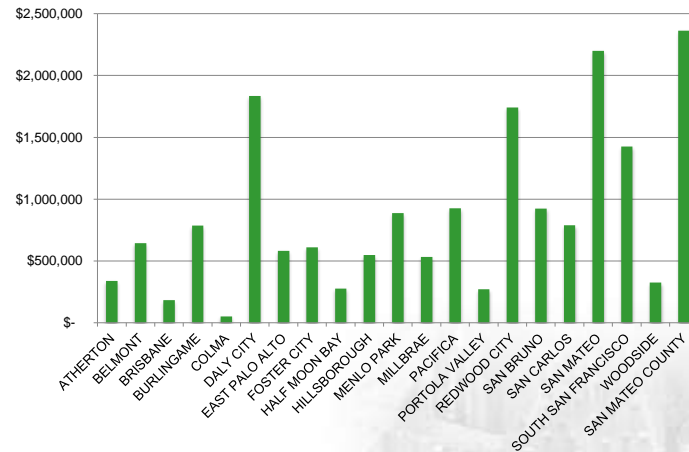

## Terms/Conditions of Funding

- TA insures the distribution of proportional share of funding on a monthly basis
- Cities may use Funding for local transportation projects and programs
- Funding may not be used to supplant other funding sources
- Cities must:
  - Provide a summary of projects and programs funded with Measure A funds
  - Provide an annual audit

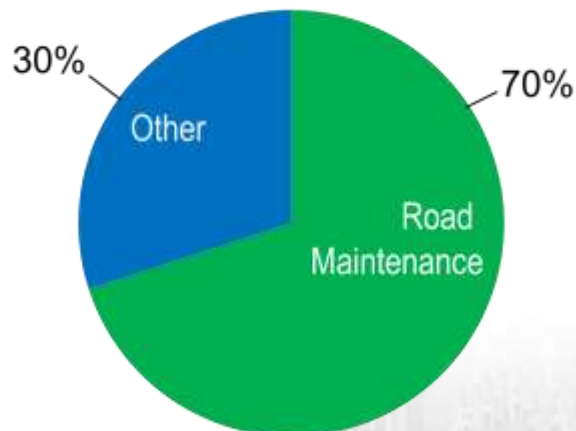

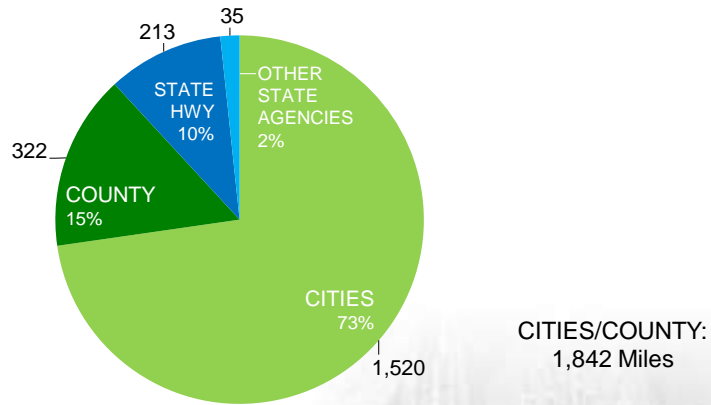
## Where the Funding Goes

## San Mateo County Publically Maintained Roadways (miles)

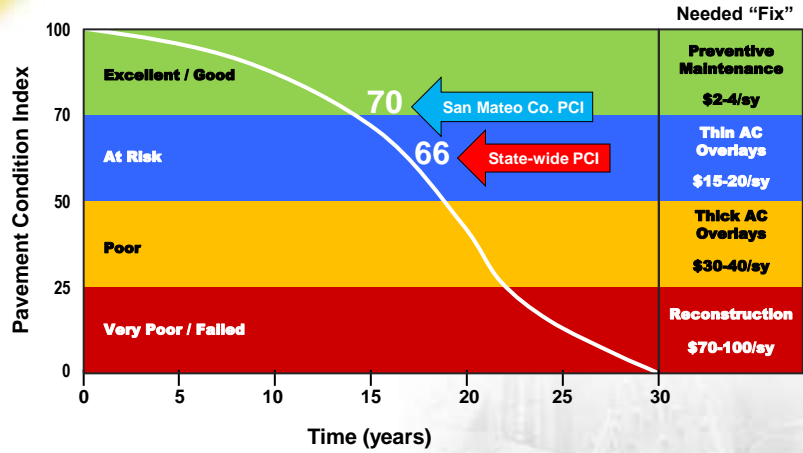


## How Far is 1,842 Miles? Fargo, ND
