### Summary of San Mateo County Transit District's Committee and Board of Directors Meetings of March 5, 2014

### The Community Relations Committee and Board

Tina Dubost, Manager, Accessible Transit Services, said the Accessibility Advisory Committee met on March 3 and received information about the new hybrid buses.

Mike Levinson, Paratransit Coordinating Council (PCC) Chair, said the MV Transportation appreciation party is on April 8. The Education Committee has scheduled a presentation in April and two more are yet to be scheduled.

Peter Ratto, Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) Chair, said at their February 26 meeting, the CAC received a presentation on the 2014-2018 Strategic Plan update. This is a new item for the entire CAC. The CAC also received a SamTrans Service Plan update.

Chuck Harvey, Deputy CEO, presented the Mobility Management Report: Shuttles (attached).

Average Weekday Ridership – January 2014 Compared to January 2013

Bus: 41,210, an increase of 4 percent.

All modes: 103,930, an increase of 8.7 percent.

### The Finance Committee and Board

- Approved the Statement of Revenues and Expenses for January 2014
- Authorized the Filing of an Application for Transit Performance Incentive Funds to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission in the Amount of \$687,240 to Help Fund the Implementation of the SamTrans Service Plan
- Authorized the Purchase of 14 Low-floor Paratransit Minivans and 19 Paratransit Vehicles from Creative Bus Sales, Inc. for a Total Cost of \$2,566,933
- Authorized Award of Contract to NVB Equipment to Furnish Vehicle Fire Suppression System Inspection and Maintenance for a Total Estimated Cost of \$243,005 for a Five-year Term
- Authorized Award of Contract to Shaw/Yoder/Antwih, Inc. and Edelstein Gilbert Robson & Smith, LLC to Provide State Legislative Advocacy Services for a Firmfixed Price of \$293,178 for a Five-year Term
- Authorized an Amendment to On-call Engineering Consulting Services with Gannett Fleming, Inc. in a Total Aggregate Not-to-Exceed Contract Amount of \$800,000 from \$1,750,000 to \$2,550,000

### The Legislative Committee and Board

### State Update

Cap and Trade is the primary focus of the budget debate. The main set of programs being considered for the funds is within transportation. The San Mateo County Transit District (District) is supportive of the proposal to fund \$50 million for rail modernization.

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The District is also supportive of the proposal for implementing sustainable communities strategies but recommends increasing the amount of funding.

There was a proposal for a new carbon tax that would replace the fuels portion of the Cap and Trade revenue. The proposal is a carbon tax on gasoline at the pump, and the initial proposal states the funds would be used to fund some tax credits and transit and transportation infrastructure and services. Funding levels could potentially be more consistent and reliable as a result.

### Federal Update

The U.S. Department of Transportation announced that \$600 million will be available under the Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery competitive grant program. Applications are due on April 28. Staff is working with the region to identify what San Mateo County priorities would be most competitive for the program because whatever is selected needs to have coordinated support from the region in order to be successful.

President Obama's budget proposal includes a \$302 billion reauthorization proposal that would fully fund the Highway Trust Fund with \$150 billion generated through a business tax overhaul that would tax companies on their overseas earnings. The President indicated that other revenue solutions would be viable.

### <u>Planning</u>, <u>Development and Sustainability Committee</u>

- Authorized Granting a Fiberoptics Easement to the Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Board Over a Portion of the Dumbarton Rail Corridor
- Received an update on the progress of the SamTrans Service Plan (SSP)
  - o Staff will bring comprehensive reports on a quarterly basis.
  - o The SSP launch went smoothly on January 26.
  - Overall it was a very complex undertaking including a lot of changes and route designations.
  - Route ECR ridership in January is up 7.9 percent, or 22,800 additional riders.
  - Staff identified 14 issues and is continuing to look at feedback received from the public.
  - o There are some issues with bus stops and running times.
  - o There have been service quality issues with some routes to schools. They are difficult for the contractor to operate.
  - Changes and improvements will be made to the SSP and it will be regarded as a living document.
- Received an update to the 2014-2018 SamTrans Strategic Plan
- Received the Quarterly Capital Progress Report 2nd Quarter Fiscal Year 2014


### Michael Scanlon, General Manager/CEO, reported:

- 2-year program FY 2015 and FY 2016
- \$7 million (TA \$6 million, C/CAG \$1 million)

### Criteria:

- Meets local mobility needs and/or provides access to regional transit
- 25% minimum local match
- Must be compliant with ADA
- Public agencies are eligible applicants
- Private entities/employers not eligible, but encouraged to partner with eligible applicants

  - Matching vehicle size/capacity to meet route demand

  - Security
  - Mechanical issues
  - Disaster
  - Accidents
