RBWTSD Recap

On 11/17/2021, Ruby Bridges Walk to School Day was celebrated to honor the Civil Rights Movement

61 years ago on November 14th, Ruby Bridges integrated an all-white elementary school in New Orleans, Louisiana. Students in San Mateo County and across the nation participated in Ruby Bridges Walk to School Day (RBWTSD) celebrating Ruby's courageous act of showing up for school each day, in spite of the vitriol she faced.

This year, 60 San Mateo County schools participated in RBWTSD. SMCOE received over 250+ entries for the RBWTSD poster contest! RBWTSD reminds us of the importance of the Civil Rights Movement, the power of education, and the greatness of diversity in our community.

Winterproof Your Ride!



Winter's Here, Time to Check Our Gears!

Ride and cycle safely this holiday season with these maintenance tips:

- Check your bike lights! Make sure your bike lights are working and bright enough to see through the fog, rain, and gloomy weather. SMCOE SRTS recommends having two lights, one on the front of the bike and one on the back.
- 2. Test your brakes. Make sure your brakes work properly. The roads are wetter and can make braking more difficult.

3. Clean and grease your bike chain, cables, and other bike parts. Due to colder weather, bike parts are more likely to corrode. A thorough cleaning with a hard bristle brush and soap can prevent build-up of dirt particles and rust. Lubricate bike parts to prevent breakage.

4. Adjust tire pressure and check traction. SMCOE SRTS recommends checking your tire pressure before every ride because colder temperatures reduce air pressure more quickly.

5. Invest in a Mudguard. Mudguards are a must in the winter time and prevent spray and grunge getting kicked up while you ride. Mudguards not only help protect your tires but prevent water and grunge spraying onto other riders.

SRTS Parent/Caregiver Survey 2021-22

Annual surveys will be going LIVE in January 2022!

Thanks to the input of parents and caregivers, SMCOE SRTS knows where to focus time and energy when we work with students, schools, and the community. A BIG THANK YOU to all who have participated in the past years! All of your comments and participation make a difference and help us create a more meaningful impact.

We've gathered data from past surveys, look what we found!

- In 2020-21, over 50% of students live less than 1-2 miles away from school.
- 80% of students who bike to/from school ALWAYS wear their helmet.
- Over 430+ students walked or roll to school during hybrid learning in 2020-2021.
- 70% of students in San Carlos biked to school in 2019-2020!
- In 2019-2020, 41% of parents/caregivers felt MOST concerned about speeding traffic. In 2020-2021, this concern was reduced to 30%.
